


Post-16 pathways

The flowchart below asks you some key questions, to help you consider the differences between the pathways available to you after secondary school.

The results are intended to be a guide, not definitive. Your responses to the questions may not be as simple as choosing one way or another - you may not mind either. Likewise, your result may not be the only pathway that suits your preferences. For these reasons, we strongly recommend that you discuss the results with a careers adviser.



A Levels

You'll study 3 or 4 different subjects. A Levels involve mostly academic study (read, writing etc.) and are largely exam based.

Vocational courses

You'll study 1
subject, mostly
assessed in class or
by coursework.
Classes are largely
focused on practical
tasks.

T Levels

You'll study 1
subject and also get
work experience
related to your
course. T levels are
assessed by exam,
coursework and
practical tasks.

Apprenticeships

You'll be employed to do a real job, earning a salary and studying a relevant qualification for the equivalent of 1 day a week.
